Course Acceptance Criteria

Proof of immunization and a mantoux test is required. Proof of Hepatitis B immunization or a signed waiver of intent to decline the Heptovax series is required to begin the course. Must be able to stand most of 8 hour shift. Before registering, you must pass the Phlebotomy Pretest to assess basic reading comprehension and listening skills. This multiple choice test takes approximately one hour. No testing fee or appointment is needed. Take it Mondays at 1 or 2 PM or Wednesdays at 9 or 10 AM in the Assessment Center, Room 185. First come, first served.

Background Check

Minnesota Law requires that any person who provides services that involve direct contact with patients have a background study conducted by the state. An individual who is disqualified from having direct patient contact as a result of the background study, and whose disqualification is not set aside by the Commissioner of Health, will not be permitted to participate in a clinical placement in a Minnesota licensed health care facility. The college will withdraw any student who is disqualified by the Minnesota Department of Health. The student is responsible for requesting the Commissioner to reconsider the disqualification
