

How to automate citations with Proquest

Three Steps:

1. From your results list (or from within each individual citation,) “mark” the article(s) by adding a checkmark(s).

- APA - recommended for psychology, education, and other social sciences.
- Chicago/Turabian/Harvard: Author-Date - references list with abbreviated author names followed by dates.
- Chicago/Turabian: Humanities - bibliography using footnotes, endnotes and full author names.
- MLA - recommended for literature, arts, and humanities.
- Vancouver - for manuscripts submitted to biomedical journals.
